



My previous roles have mainly been in the area of Sexual health and Sexual Offences and it was whilst working in these areas that I first became interested in research. During this time I worked on a project that was aimed at supporting families who had experienced sexual violence. CAHPR Conference Bursary 2019— The conference bursary scheme for 2019 is now open to support student and early career researchers throughout the UK in presenting their research at conferences. The scheme will provide funding to attend conferences using the model set up by the London hub last year, but is open UK-wide.

The bursary scheme is competitive and is primarily aimed at supporting student and early career researchers, who have abstracts accepted for poster or platform presentations at conferences. AHP applicants may request £500 to support attendance at an international conference or £250 for a national conference. Awards will be made on a competitive basis and will be reviewed by volunteers from the hubs. Deadline: 14th August 2019.




UPDATE FROM SALLY FOWLER-DAVIS
